

Criminal Alien Deportation Enforcement Act of 2016

Section by Section

Purpose: To withhold foreign aid to countries who do not accept their citizens who have committed crimes in the United States back into the country and to prohibit visas from being issued until the country accepts back their citizens

Section 1

This bill is titled the “Criminal Alien Deportation Enforcement Act of 2016”.

Section 2

This section amends the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 to prohibit foreign aid funds from being provided to countries that refuse to take back their citizens or residents after they have received a final order of removal from a U.S. court within 90 days. The Secretary of Homeland Security would be required to submit a report to Congress every three months that lists all of the uncooperative countries. If a country is listed in this report, no visas may be issued to its citizens until they are in full compliance with the law. Countries that delay the acceptance of their criminal aliens by more than 100 days and by 200 days for their non-criminal aliens by 100 days will be subject to the foreign aid sanctions. This section also ensures that victims of crimes committed by the aliens described in this section will have standing to sue in a Federal district court.

Section 3

This section lists the amended language of section 243(d) of the Immigration and Nationality Act which discontinues the granting of visas to uncooperative countries. Any visa issued to the uncooperative country will be declared null and void.
