1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

3	SECTION 1. CARRYING OF CONCEALED HANDGUNS BY

5	(a) In General.—Chapter 44 of title 18, United
6	States Code, is amended by inserting after section 926C

3	"(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a
4	Member of Congress who is carrying the identification re-
5	quired by subsection (e), to whom a State or the United
6	States Capitol Police has issued a license or permit to
7	carry a concealed handgun, and who is not otherwise pro-
8	hibited by this chapter from transporting, shipping, or re-
9	ceiving a firearm, may carry a concealed handgun for any
10	lawful purpose, subject to the terms and conditions of the
11	license or permit (if issued by the United States Capitol
12	Police), anywhere in the United States, except as provided
13	in subsection (b).
14	"(b)(1) Subsection (a) shall not apply in or on the
15	grounds of the White House, or wherever the United
16	States Secret Service is prohibiting the possession of a
