Dear Mr. President:

We write to you today asking that you immediately reject calls from Congressional Democrats to include amnesty in the \$3.5 trillion budget reconciliation framework. Simply engaging in this very debate will further destabilize the crisis at the border and bankroll vicious criminal cartels. 
